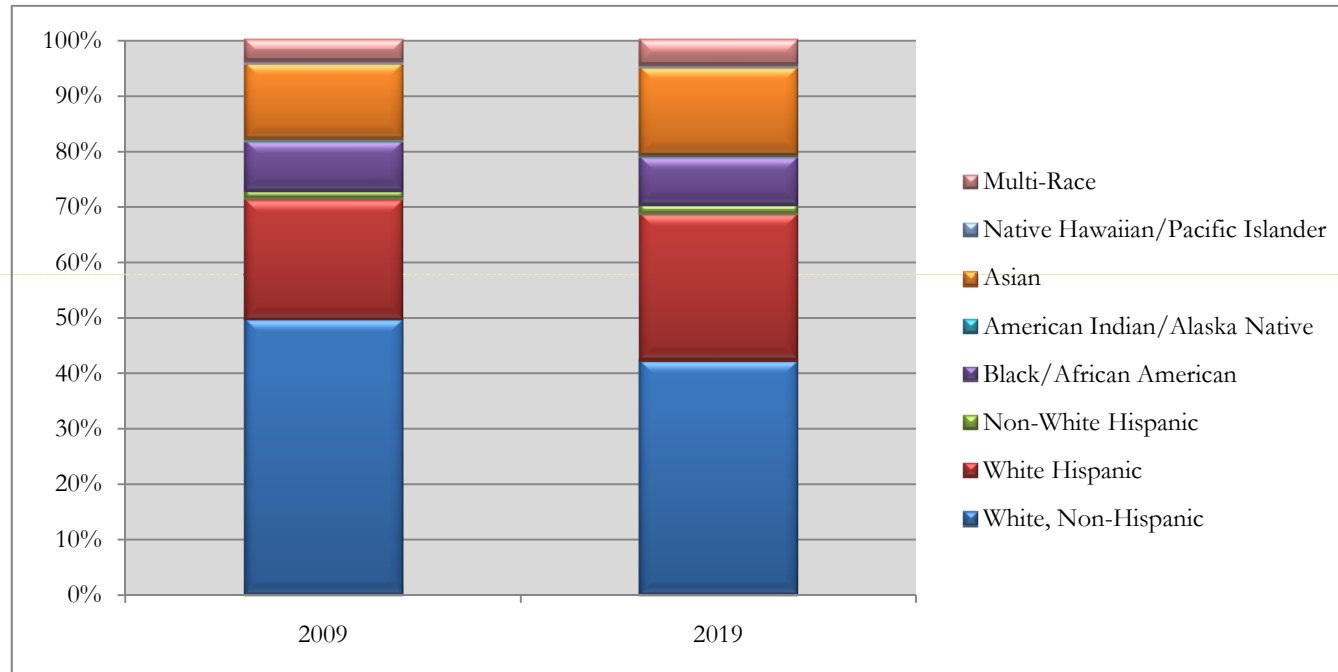

- From 2009 to 2019, the total population of Contra Costa County is projected to grow 13%, from 1,038,988 to 1,168,965—an increase of 129,977 residents.

- Hispanic population will grow, increasing the subpopulation's share of the total population to 26.3%; Asian population will grow, increasing this group's share of the county population to 15.9%; and Non-Hispanic White population will diminish, decreasing the group's share of the county population to 42.2%.



Population by Age Group, Contra Costa County


- Over the next ten years, the proportion of residents aged 60 to 79 will increase from 14.5% to 19.0% of Contra Costa's total population. The increase is due to aging and not migration.
- The proportion of Contra Costa residents aged 10 to 24 years will decrease. Whereas, in 2009, residents in this age group accounted for 20.5% of the county's population, in 2019, they will account for only 18.1%.

- By 2019, there will be nearly 416,000 foreign born residents primarily from Latin America and Asia. This populations is unlikely to speak English fluently.

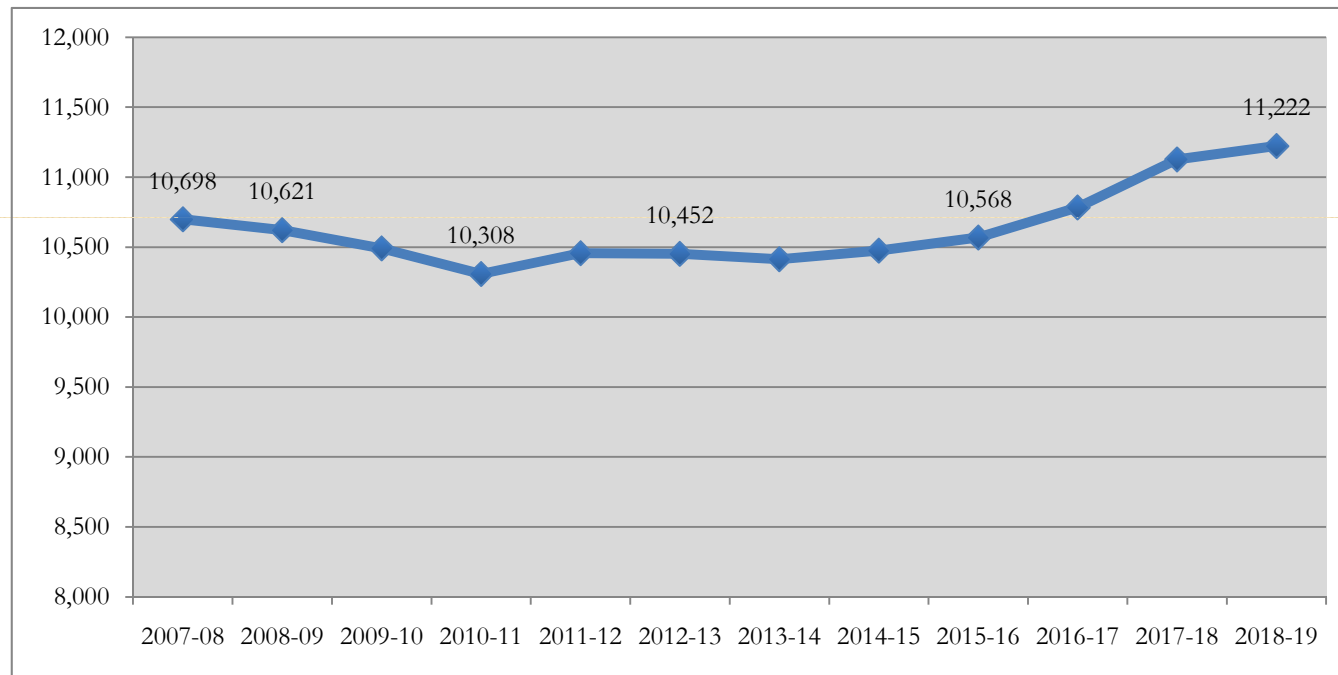

- Encouragingly for CCCCD, in Contra Costa County, both K-12 enrollment and high school graduation figures will increase over the next decade. Enrollment will increase by 3.5%, from 166,796 to 175,048 students.

- The number of high school graduates is projected to increase by 5.7%, from 10,621 to 11,222. However, population projection data indicate that the increase in high school graduates, in the year 2019, may only be a temporary uptick in a downward five-year trend.

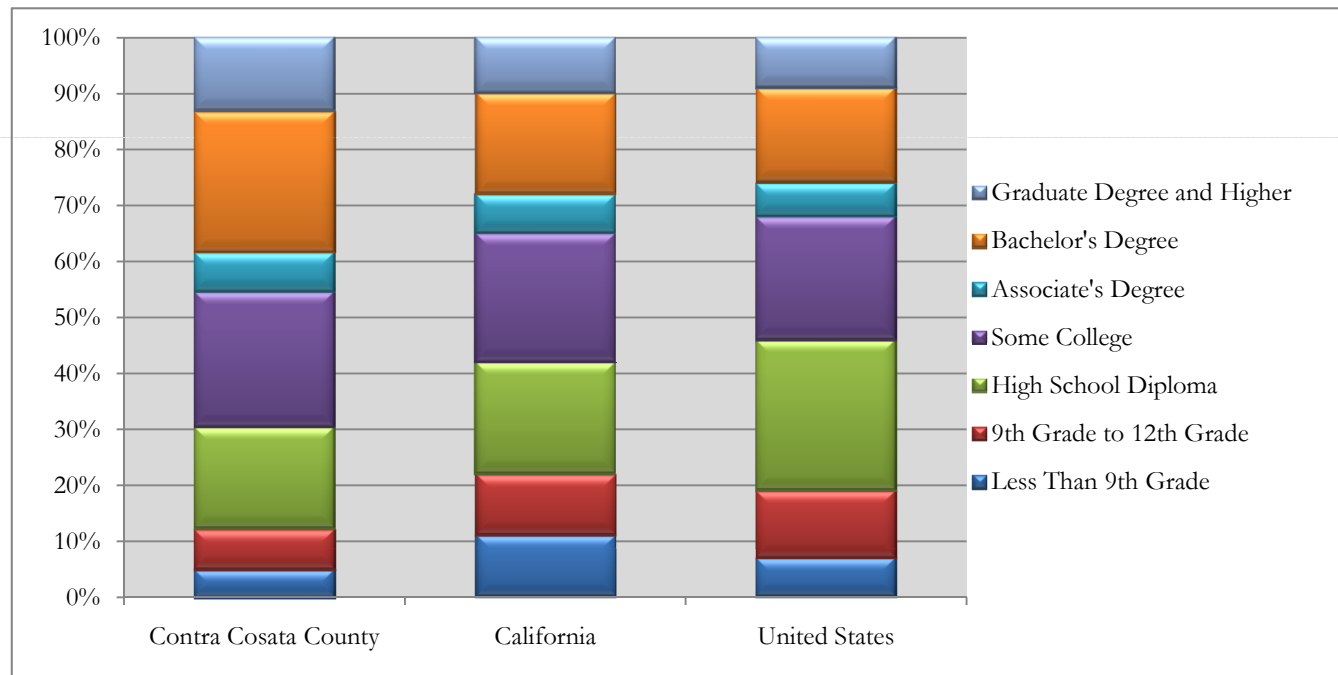
Demographic Analysis of CCCCD

- Over the next decade, for the most part, CCCCD's student body will mirror the changes in Contra Costa County's population.
- Projections indicate, the proportion of Hispanics will increase most significantly, from 19.7% to 27.6% of the student body. Asian students will increase their share from 16.9% to 18.3%. The proportion of Non-Hispanic White students will remain nearly the same.
- CCCCD's student body will also age considerably: the proportion of students 19 years or younger will decrease from 32.1% to 19.3%, while the proportion of students 50 years or over will increase from 8.7% to 15.7%.

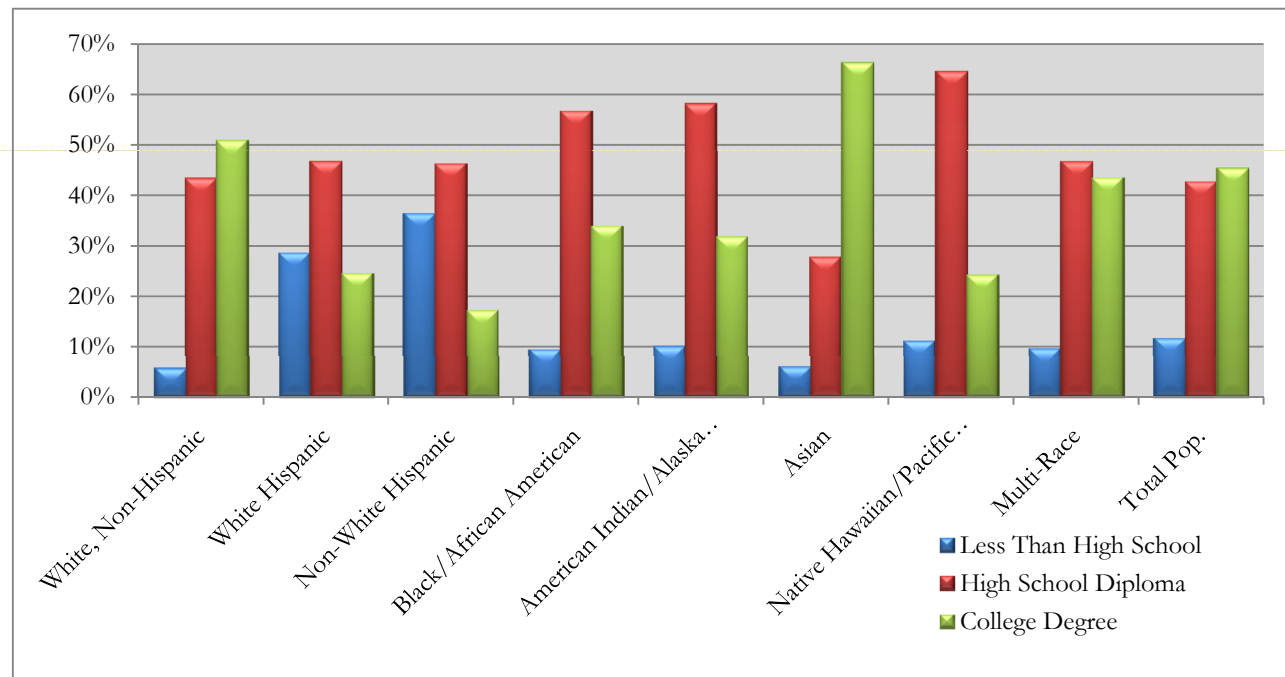
Education Attainment, Contra Costa County, California, and United States (2019)

- The education attainment of Contra Costa County residents is projected to remain very nearly unchanged, from 2009 to 2019.

- In 2019, Non-Hispanic Whites and Asians are the most highly educated. In contrast, Hispanics are the least well educated. In 2019, 24.6% of White Hispanics and 17.2% of Non-White Hispanics are projected to possess a college degree, figures which are well below the total population figure of 45.5%.
