Terms and Conditions

A deposit of \$300 per person made to Consolidated Tours Organization is required to reserve a space in the program. Final payment must be made 60 days prior to departure.

Cancellations: Cancellations must be made in writing to Consolidated Tours. Cancellations made up to 60 days prior to departure, refunds will be made less a \$100.00 per person administrative fee. Cancellations made 59-36 days prior to departure will be subject to a \$300 per person administrative fee. Cancellations received 35 days or less prior to departure have to pay a charge equivalent to 75% of the cost of the basic tour from New York. **NO SHOW, NO REFUND.** Cancellation charges with medical reasons certified by a hospital and accepted by airlines and suppliers will only be made based on refunds from suppliers less a \$300.00 per person administrative fee. Cancellation insurance is highly recommended. No refunds for services or sightseeing rendered and not used by tour members.

Not Included: Expense of passports, visa fee totaling \$30.00 per person, laundry, mineral water, lunches and after dinner coffee or tea or other items not found on the menu, excessive baggage expenses, and all items of a personal nature, plus those not listed as being included in the tour price.

Insurance: Consolidated Tours offers an insurance policy through Insure America that covers trip cancellation, delay, interruption, and emergency medical care. Insurance is optional and the cost is \$156.

Release:

1. If, in the opinion of my college or Consolidated Tours Organization, my behavior is deemed unacceptable, I may be sent home at my own expense or that of my parent/guardian, and I will receive no refund for any services not received.
2. Consolidated Tours Organization may use statements made by me, photographs and video footage of me, for publicity and advertising purposes.
3. I hereby release Consolidated Tours Organization, my college or university, or other sponsor of my program, for any loss or damage arising from any cause whatsoever, and, without restricting the generality of foregoing shall not hold Consolidated Tours Organization or my college responsible for any sickness, injury or death, nor for any loss or damage arising from any errors or omissions contained in this brochure or other Consolidated Tours Organization or college literature, late or non-confirmation or acceptance of bookings and loss or damage caused by delays. In addition, Consolidated Tours Organization shall have the right, at any time in its discretion and without liability or cost therefore, to cancel any program or make an alteration in route, accommodations, price and/or details in the event of any program being rendered impossible or inadvisable by weather, strikes, war, civil unrest, terrorism, acts of God, government interference or any cause whatsoever that is beyond Consolidated Tours Organization's control. Any and all expenses incurred as a result thereof shall be the responsibility of the participant.

Students will study for 16 days in Egypt, one of the most important civilizations in the ancient world, located along the Nile River in northeast Africa. This once in a lifetime experience will include visiting various museums and several dozen archaeological sites and monuments, such as pyramids, tombs, temples, and ancient residential sites.

Egypt is known for its spectacular pyramids, powerful pharaohs, and significant contributions to the arts, sciences, and other fields, such as literature, medicine, religion, mathematics, architecture, astrology, and astronomy.

The study abroad program gives students a unique opportunity for cultural and academic enrichment, and to learn about the most enduring of the classical African civilizations.

- The famous Valley of the Kings/Queens and Noble Tombs, including the Tomb of King Tut & Temple of Queen Hatshepsut.

Class Information

Students will register for CCC Afram 300 Field Studies (3 units) before leaving for Egypt. They will register for the class at one of the orientation sessions. Students are required to attend two class sessions before the tour, and attend all of the daily excursions and one-hour evening presentations.
