EMERGENCY PROCEDURES



In Case of Emergency:

- 1. Remain calm.
- 2. Alert others.
- 3. If you are not in a safe area, move to an area that is safe.
- 4. If the situation is life-threatening, dial 9-1-1 (or 9-9-1-1 from office phones).

In all other cases, notify District Police at LMC (925) 439-1505, DVC (925) 686-5547 or CCC (510) 236-2820.

 Activate the nearest fire alarm pull station. Evacuate the building or area. Do not enter smoke- or flame-filled areas. Stay low to the ground. Do not use elevators. Assist those with disabilities. Proceed to the nearest safe Assembly Area. Provide first aid to any injured. Remain at the Assembly Area until otherwise directed. Do not re-enter buildings until authorized by site officials. 	 If it is safe to do so, provide first aid for the injured or ill person. Whenever possible, avoid contact with blood, vomit, or other bodily fluids and use appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (gloves, mask, etc.). Do not move seriously injured people except as necessary to avoid immediate, life-threatening danger. Send someone to meet and guide responders. 	 Go to a safe indoor location Close and lock (or barricade) all doors and windows. Close blinds and move away from windows. Shut off ventilation equipment and lights. Take cover behind heavy furnishings or walls. Do not open doors unless instructed to do so by recognized officials. Listen to a portable radio (740 AM or 106.9 FM), tune to KTVU-2 (TV), or go to http://www.4cd.edu for updates and information. 	 Be aware of your surroundings at all times. Trust your instincts. Avoid walking alone—especially at night. If you need an escort, call District Police to request one. Immediately report suspicious activities, behavior, or persons to police. Never leave valuables unattended. Log off computers and secure office areas when you leave—even for a short time. Keep office and personal keys secured at all times.
