	4.	FSCC WEBSITE Organ asked Patton to work on the FSCC web page and report back at the next meeting.
	5.	CONSTITUTION DAY  Council agreed they need to be prepared with a response for the board on how faculty will participate in Constitution Day. Council will discuss it at their next meeting prior to DGC.
	6.	DGC MEMBERSHIP Council discussed how to ensure SRC and Brentwood Center have a presence at DGC. Council acknowledged that a representative from the center can be from any constituency. Council agreed faculty have eight spots on DGC and two of them should be dedicated to a representative from each SRC and Brentwood. FSCC will take action on this at their next meeting.
	7.	REPEATABILITY (information/discussion) Organ proposed forming a sub-committee of the FSCC of the college curriculum chairs to provide recommendations to FSCC on the issues of repeatability. The sub-committee should meet twice a semester. Their recommendations should include applying courses to course family structures for new courses, determining similar courses, and determining if a class is outside of the course family structure. Council agreed Tribble will check with the curriculum chairs about the frequency of meetings needed. Council agreed these should be standing meetings.  Organ said in light of the impact this is having on enrollment, Glenn Appell has proposed a meeting of the Chancellor, the UF, the FSCC chair, and ASU Representative to begin developing strategies to push back on these regulations at the state level.  Lema moved to approve the participation of the FSCC Chair in meetings with the chancellor, the UF and to address strategies for repealing these regulations on repeatability.  Council will vote on this matter at their next meeting.
