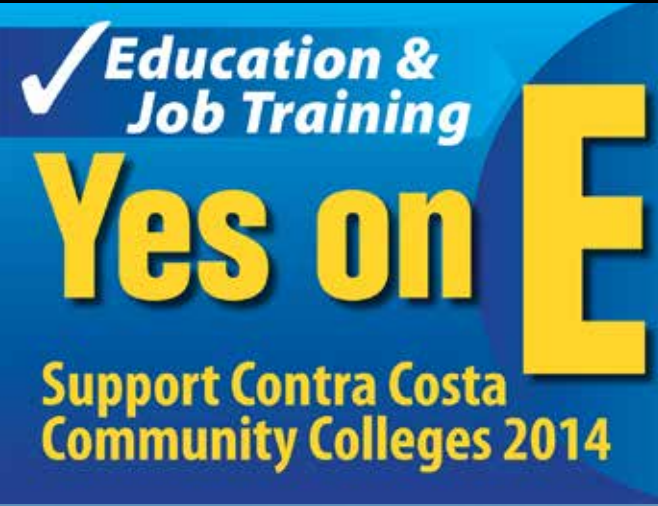


Contra Costa County voters pass Measure E in 2014, the District's third bond measure providing \$450 million for facility improvements.



Fred E. Wood is selected as the 8th permanent District Chancellor in 2016.



In 2017 and 2019, LMC was recognized by the Aspen Institute as one of 150 community colleges nationwide eligible to compete for the \$1 million Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence.



Mojdeh Mehdizadeh becomes Contra Costa College's 11th permanent president in 2016.



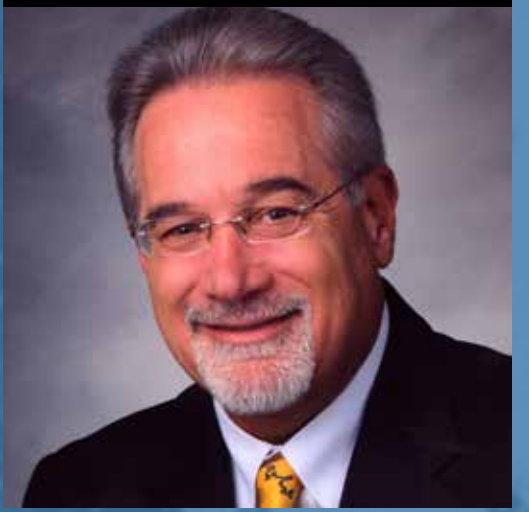
Robert Kratochvil becomes LMC's 6th permanent president in 2012.



In August 2018, the District launched the FT3 program, which offers free tuition for first-time, full-time students attending CCC, DVC or LMC.



After serving as LMC President for seven years, Peter Garcia became the 7th permanent President of DVC in 2010.



The Governing Board passed Resolution No. 1-S in January 2017.



Established in 2013, CCC's Gateway to College is a nationally recognized dual enrollment high school diploma program for marginalized students. In partnership with WCCUSD, the program has graduated over 250 students and provided valuable college experience.



DVC was the top community college in California in awarding Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT) for the 2015-16 academic year and received the 2019 Champion of Higher Education from The Campaign for College Opportunity for exemplary work in implementing ADTs.

CCC's College Center, the largest bond-funded project in the District's history, was completed in 2016 and features a three-level General Education building that includes a 201-seat lecture hall.



Completion of the DVC – Pleasant Hill Campus Commons area in 2015 included a new Student Services Center, Culinary Arts and Food Services building and a relocated Commons area.



The new Los Medanos College Student Union spans 35,400 square-feet and houses a bookstore, student lounge, food services, offices, meeting rooms and a 485-seat community conference center.



The DVC – San Ramon Campus gets a makeover in 2019 with the removal of the campus' water fountain to make room for a Library and Learning Resource Center.



The District purchased a new site for the Brentwood Center in 2011, received official Center status in 2012, and broke ground at the new site on Pioneer Road in 2018.
