



CCC's College Center, the largest bond-funded project in the District's history, was completed in 2016 and features a three-level General Education building that includes a 201-seat lecture hall.

Completion of the DVC – Pleasant Hill Campus Commons area in 2015 included a new Student Services Center, Culinary Arts and Food Services building and a relocated Commons area.

The new Los Medanos College Student Union spans 35,400 square-feet and houses a bookstore, student lounge, food services, offices, meeting rooms and a 485-seat community conference center.



The DVC – San Ramon Campus gets a makeover in 2019 with the removal of the campus' water fountain to make room for a Library and Learning Resource Center.



The District purchased a new site for the Brentwood Center in 2011, received official Center status in 2012, and broke ground at the new site on Pioneer Road in 2018.
