Governing Board Regular Meeting of May 27, 2015

The Contra Costa Community College District (District) Governing Board met at the George R. Gordon Education Center on May 27, 2015. The meeting began with closed session at 5:00 p.m., followed by the regular meeting at 6:00 p.m.

Highlights of the meeting follow.

Outgoing Student Trustee Recognized

Student trustee and Diablo Valley College (DVC) student JoNai Davis-Hendricks was recognized by the Governing Board for her contributions to the District. Davis-Hendricks assumed the office of student trustee following the resignation of Elijah Ziskin in November 2014.

New Agreements Approved

The Governing Board approved a number of agreements including:

- a new Contra Costa College (CCC) agreement with SARS Software Products, Inc., to provide software licenses, support and professional development services for the purpose of completing the student success and support program requirements;
- a new DVC agreement with Nebraska Book Company to upgrade the existing point of sale and inventory control systems (DVC, SRC and Los Medanos College (LMC);
- a new District Office agreement with Career Ladders Project/Foundation for California Community Colleges to provide professional development and technical assistance support for the regional Diablo Gateways to Innovation California Pathways Trust Grant; and
- a new LMC agreement with Contra Costa Child Care Council to provide two forcredit child development classes.

Out-of-State Field Trips

The Governing Board approved an out-of-state field trip for 18 DVC students to travel to the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland and Princeton University, to participate in two water polo tournaments. All costs will be paid by the students and no college funds will be used.

Increase in Parking Fees

Governing Board approval of parking fee increases will begin in the fall 2015 semester. Examples of some of the changes include a semester parking permit increasing from \$40 to \$48, and a new mid-semester parking permit will cost \$24. A summer session parking permit will also increase from \$20 to \$25.

The meeting was adjourned in the memory of Vincent Custodio, retired CCC counselor and LMC Dean of Behavioral Sciences; Gaylord Bryan, retired DVC coach for the men's basketball team, track and field/cross country teams, and women's softball teams; and Carolyn Harris, retired CCC business instructor.
