

# Governing Board Meeting / Study Session of April 27, 2016

The Contra Costa Community College District (District) Governing Board met at the George R. Gordon Education Center on April 27, 2016. The regular meeting began with closed session at 3:00 p.m., followed by public study session at 4:00 p.m. and a reception for tenured faculty and the classified employee of the year.

Highlights of the meeting follow.

#### 2016-17 Budget Study Session

The Governing Board held a study session to discuss and provide input on the development of the District's 2016-17 budget.

## **Governing Board Reception**

The Governing Board held a reception to honor faculty members Districtwide who have achieved tenure, and the classified employee of the year, Los Medanos College's Eric Sanchez.

## **Measure E Bond Update**

A special presentation was shared on updated plans to spend 2014 Measure E bond funds.

## **New Agreements Approved**

The Governing Board approved a number of agreements, including:

- a new Contra Costa College (CCC) agreement with the Gateway to College National Network to support operating expenses of the Gateway to College program;
- a Diablo Valley College (DVC) renewal agreement with the Regents of the University of California to increase student transfers to the University of California;

- a new District Office agreement with Peralta Community College District to collaborate on the application and implementation of a California Apprenticeship Initiative New and Innovative Grant on behalf of the East Bay Advanced Manufacturing Transportation Apprenticeship Council; and
- o a new Los Medanos College (LMC) agreement with San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District to provide training to students in the field of electronics/electricity with a focus on the transportation industry as part of a Department of Transportation grant.

#### **Student Trustee Privileges**

Privileges for the District's Student Trustee, previously approved by the Governing Board, will be extended to May 6, 2017, including a monthly compensation of \$400.

#### **Proposition 30 Spending**

The Governing Board reviewed and approved the District expenditures made possible by funds raised from Proposition 30, The Schools and Local Public Safety Protection Act of 2012.

The meeting was adjourned in memory of Jimmy Stubblefield, retired DVC counselor and Robert Moore, retired CCC food services supervisor.
