Governing Board Meeting of September 13, 2017

The Contra Costa Community College District (District) Governing Board met at the George R. Gordon Education Center on September 13, 2017. The meeting began with closed session at 4:00 p.m., followed by public session at 6:00 p.m.

Highlights of the meeting follow.

2017-18 Adoption Budget

The Governing Board held a public hearing and unanimously approved the 2017-18 adoption budget.

New Agreements Approved

The Governing Board unanimously approved a number of agreements, including:

- a new Contra Costa College (CCC) agreement with the Richmond Community Foundation to provide SparkPoint services, including financial services that support student persistence, such as budgeting, credit and financial coaching;
- a Diablo Valley College (DVC) renewal agreement with Contra Costa County, Employment and Human Services, to provide education and training for foster/adoptive parents;
- a new District Office agreement with the Contra Costa Economic Partnership to provide services to enhance connection of the CCC Forklift, Logistics, Operations and Warehouse program for industry partners, including curriculum advisory, awareness of the program and a pre-program internship plan to increase recruitment into the courses; and
- a Los Medanos College renewal agreement with Burton Book Foundation to provide textbook fund support to students who are eligible for the Burton Book Fund.

Resolutions Approved

The Governing Board approved the following resolutions:

- Declaration of September 17, 2017, as Constitution Day;
- Recognition of National Hispanic Heritage Month, September 15, 2017, to October 15, 2017, Shaping the Bright Future of America; and
- Support for Out-of-State Travel Funding Restrictions to states that discriminate against the LGBTQ+ community, including Alabama, Kansas, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, and Texas.

The meeting was adjourned in memory of Paul Yeager, retired DVC chemistry professor, and Clair (Gus) Gustafson, retired DVC English professor.
