

Governing Board Meeting of October 10, 2018

The Contra Costa Community College District (District) Governing Board met at the George R. Gordon Education Center on October 10, 2018. The meeting began at 5:00 p.m. with closed session, followed by the public meeting at 6:00 p.m.

National Hispanic Heritage Month Resolution

Unanimous approval by the Governing Board was given to approve the Resolution recognizing September 15, 2018, to October 15, 2018, as National Hispanic Heritage Month.

Recognition for Gary Walker-Roberts

The Governing Board recognized outgoing Board Vice President Gary Walker-Roberts for his contributions to the District and its students.

Capital Improvement Bond Program Update

The Governing Board received an update on the District's bond program, and heard plans to increase bond spending over the next few years.

New Agreements Approved

The Governing Board approved a number of agreements, including:

- a Contra Costa College renewal agreement with The Wright Institute to provide counseling and team-building support for Middle College High School students;
- a Diablo Valley College renewal agreement with the International Education Center to provide two credit courses in the fall 2018 semester;
- a new District agreement with Pacific Gas & Electric Company to provide design and installation services of electronic vehicle charging stations Districtwide; and
- o a Los Medanos College (LMC) renewal agreement with Pittsburg California Theatre to provide rights for the use of the facility to hold events and productions.

Out-of-State Field Trip

Approval by the Governing Board was given to four LMC students to travel to Washington D.C. from February 13-17, 2019, to participate in a national conference entitled, "Science Transcending Boundaries."
