Governing Board Regular Meeting of March 11, 2026

The Contra Costa Community College District (4CD) Governing Board conducted a regular meeting on Wednesday, March 11, 2026, beginning at 5:00 p.m., followed by closed session, and continuation of the public session at 6:00 p.m.

Update on Artificial Intelligence (AI) Initiatives Across 4CD

Districtwide Dean of Distance Education and Digital Equity Dr. Emma Rogers provided an update on 4CD's key initiatives and ongoing priorities supporting thoughtful and equitable engagement with AI.

Classified Professional of the Year

Diablo Valley College custodian Arturo Torres was nominated by 4CD employees and selected by the 4CD Classified Senate as Classified Professional of the Year. Nominees are evaluated on their commitment to Vision 2030 and equitable student outcomes; professional ethics and standards; serving the institution's diverse student population through participation in professional and/or community activities; and serving as a leader beyond their location institution.

Women's History Month Resolution

The Governing Board approved Resolution No. 21B declaring March 2026 as Women's History Month. This year's theme is "Leading the Change: Women Shaping a Sustainable Future," and it focuses on the celebration of women's roles in creating enduring environmental, economic, educational, and social transformations, with a focus on sustainability beyond just the planet.

American Red Cross Month Resolution

The Governing Board approved Resolution No. 21A declaring March 2026 as American Red Cross Month, celebrating the organization's achievements in Contra Costa County in 2025. Its 1,148 volunteers held 530 blood drives and collected over 18,299 units of blood, helped 463 military members and their families, trained over 12,164 people in vital skills, including first aid and CPR, to help others survive medical emergencies, and installed 778 smoke alarms to make households safer in Contra Costa County.
