American Graduation Initiative

Cabinet received a briefing on this initiative from American Association of Community Colleges' David Baime, and a presentation on HR 3221, the legislation that provides the resources to achieve the goals of the initiative.

Direct Lending Transition

College Financial Aid directors updated the Cabinet on their progress to transition to this program by July 2010.

Districtwide Clean Energy Workforce Training Program

Cabinet was given an overview of the \$1 million grant awarded to the District for the Clean Energy Workforce Training Program. All three campuses will provide training that is projected to help 180 students get clean energy jobs.

Districtwide Contest to Save Energy

Consensus was reached by Cabinet to approve a contest led by the District sustainability committee to reduce energy use and costs.

New Procedures Receive Final Approval

Cabinet gave final approval to Human Resources Procedure 2030.13, <u>Evaluation of Contract Administrators</u>, and Human Resources Procedure 3080.05, <u>Evaluation of Classified Contract Administrators</u>. In addition, Cabinet gave final approval to Business Procedure 7.08, <u>Parking Fees</u>, and Business Procedure 20.01, <u>Parking and Traffic Regulations</u>.
