District Office Moves to Summer 4-Day Work Week

In an effort to determine if energy cost savings are significant, Cabinet reached consensus to have the District Office pilot a Summer 4-day work week similar to the colleges beginning June 4, 2010, and ending July 30, 2010.

Transfer Certificates

Cabinet continued to make progress on an initiative to help students understand the value of obtaining a transfer certificate and to increase the number of transfer certificates awarded.

Elimination of Blue Phones

Consensus was reached by Cabinet to remove the blue phones used for emergency situations at the colleges. A safety awareness campaign will be developed to ensure students and staff feel safe on the campuses.

Final Approval Given to HR Procedure

Cabinet gave final approval to revisions made to Human Resources Procedure 2090.07, Faculty Reassigned Time Guidelines.
