## Mission

#### **Workforce Development Board Presentation**

Cabinet heard a presentation by Workforce Development Board of Contra Costa County's Stephen Baiter, and explored possible future opportunities to work together.

#### 2010-11 Adoption Budget

Cabinet reviewed the draft 2010-11 adoption budget and learned of budget issues that could potentially impact the District.

#### **Resolutions from Municipalities**

Cabinet learned of resolutions received from the cities of Pleasant Hill and San Pablo at the request of a community member, urging the District's congressional representatives to seek additional funding for the District.

### **Alignment of Strategic Planning Processes and Timelines**

Consensus was reached by Cabinet on a recommendation to align the District's and the colleges' strategic planning to be in synch by July 1, 2014, the implementation date of the next District strategic plan.

#### **Future of College Bookstores**

Cabinet began a discussion on the future of college bookstores given the changing landscape as a result of textbook rentals and availability of books online.

#### **4CDLI Proposals**

Cabinet reviewed and decided on next steps to each of the seven 4CDLI proposals.
