Mission

Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College Training Grant Planning

The District is coordinating statewide with Career Ladders on healthcare, developmental technology and transportation in developing a proposal for the Trade Adjustment Assistance federal grant. The deadline for submission is April 21, 2011. A meeting with partners throughout the state has already been held.
