Analysis on District Financial Aid Default Rates

Cabinet reviewed the most recent loan default rates by college and requested additional information to improve service to students and minimize financial aid abuse.

District Learning Management System Recommendation

Cabinet reviewed and gave support to the recommendation from the district learning management system task force to use Desire2Learn.
