District Response to SB 1143

Cabinet discussed the draft recommendations from the State Chancellor's Task Force on Student Success, and agreed to hold a Districtwide meeting on November 1, 2011, to craft a response to the draft recommendations. Governing Board members and all employees will be invited to participate in this conversation.

2012 4CDLI Update

Cabinet received an update on plans to conduct the 2012 4CDLI program beginning in February 2012. Cabinet will get the opportunity to review and approve the candidates at their November 29, 2012, meeting.

Datatel Update in April 2012

A major Datatel upgrade is scheduled to take place in April 2012 which will impact the availability of certain programs such as Colleague, student schedules, InSite portal, Webadvisor, and Financial Aid.

Cabinet reviewed a recent evaluation of the liabilities associated with the District's current retiree health program. This information will be shared with the Governing Board at their January 25, 2012, meeting.
