Statewide Institutional Effectiveness Advisory Committee

An update was provided to Cabinet on the Statewide Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative grant. The program has been created to provide technical assistance and establish a clearinghouse for best practices for requesting colleges and/or districts.

Workforce and Economic Development Update

Cabinet received an update on the District's portfolio of grants. This update will also be made at the April 22, 2015, Governing Board meeting.
