### Mission

#### **Compressed Calendar**

Cabinet discussed and reached consensus for the three colleges to move forward in offering a compressed calendar.

Cabinet reviewed and made decisions regarding the five 4CDLI presentations that were made. A decision on the final presentation will be made after its November 25, 2014, scheduled meeting date.
