Mission

The mission of the Chancellor's Cabinet is to serve as the leadership team ensuring the capacity of our District to educate students effectively and meet the needs of our communities in partnership with classified staff, faculty, and other managers.

Districtwide Service Awards Program

Cabinet discussed and reached consensus to eliminate the districtwide service awards program and allow the colleges to incorporate this celebration into their local effort.

Districtwide Distance Education

Cabinet discussed the 4CD Online Teaching Institute and received support from the college presidents to implement the training. The first one will be done by the District Office, with follow-up training sessions and the costs associated with the institute facilitator will be covered by the colleges.

District Power Purchase Agreement

Cabinet considered the idea of entering into a power purchase agreement with a third party and the goal of building new facilities as zero net energy users.

College Promise Program

Cabinet began discussion on the District vision using the newly created AB 19 California College Promise program funds.

Cornerstone

Cabinet approved the District's participation in Cornerstone, a software tool that helps manage professional development and compliance programs for employee.

Districtwide Service Recognition

Cabinet reached consensus to eliminate the districtwide service recognition awards event as a separate event. The colleges agreed to continue recognizing these employees who have worked in the District over 20 years along with their efforts to recognize those with 5, 10 and 15 years of service.

AB 19 Implementation

Cabinet began discussing how the colleges will implement AB 19, the College Promise

program. Tim will work with the college marketing directors to create visual elements to promote the campaign.

Facilities Master Plans

Cabinet reached consensus to hire a consultant to assist the colleges in updating their facilities master plans.
