## **Mission**

The mission of the Chancellor's Cabinet is to serve as the leadership team ensuring the capacity of our District to educate students effectively and meet the needs of our communities in partnership with classified staff, faculty, and other managers.

## **WiFi Upgrade Options**

It was agreed to move forward with Option #2, estimating between \$4.5 to \$5.0 million for the WiFi Infrastructure Upgrade and Expansion Project over the three-year implementation cycle. Funding will come through the utilizing of the remaining AB19 funding along with other college resources as determined by each site.

## **District Strategic Plan**

Cabinet heard and provided input to include a new objective associated with Technology Updates. The plan now goes to the Governing Board for approval at their June 26, 2019, Governing Board meeting.

## **Electric Vehicle Charging Stations**

Cabinet reviewed and approved a recommended pricing structure for electric vehicle charging stations to be placed at the campuses. Further analysis will be done to ensure the pricing structure is at least a break-even proposition for the District.

## **Interconnection Agreements**

Cabinet reached consensus to approve the PG&E Interconnection Agreements at each college. Further analysis will be done to determine how the colleges will pay this additional expense.
