Mission

Cabinet Retreat

Cabinet held a retreat to discuss a vision to achieve the 2020-25 District Strategic Plan. In addition, Bryan will be advocating to the Governing Board a multi-year re-engagement campaign to build up the District's FTES in preparation for the new Student Centered Funding Formula takes effect in 2024.

COVID Planning

Cabinet continued holding several special meetings to prepare the District for the return of students to campus once it is safe to do so. A memorandum of understanding has been signed to allow Contra Costa Health Services to administer vaccinations at the college campuses. Conversations began on possible spending priorities if new federal stimulus funding is provided to community colleges.

Employee Stipends

Cabinet was updated on a plan to offer all District employees, including faculty and classified professionals, a stipend to address unforeseen expenses related to working remotely.
