Mission

2021 Summer and Fall Plans

Cabinet continued discussing how the campuses will offer courses and student services during the summer and fall 2021 terms.

Campus HVAC Assessment and Repairs

Cabinet discussed the selection of consultants to provide an assessment of the colleges HVAC systems. This assessment will help inform the colleges which classrooms and buildings can safely accommodate returning students to campus, and the timeline in which the repairs will be completed.

Strong Workforce Funding

Cabinet continued conversations on reallocating Strong Workforce Program funding so that certain college projects could be completed by reallocating funds from the other colleges.

HEERF Allocation

Cabinet discussed options for distributing the pending federal relief funding to students and to the colleges.

JobLinks

Cabinet reached consensus to hold the annual JobLinks professional development event for classified professionals on Thursday, June 3, 2021.

Enrollment Recovery Campaign

Cabinet continued receiving updates on the RFQ/RFP process to select a vendor to assist the colleges in rebuilding enrollment over the next three years.

Fall 2021 Principles and Statement

After working with constituent groups, Cabinet reached agreement on a set of principles and statement in how the colleges will develop the course schedule for the fall 2021 term.
