Mission

Districtwide Managers Retreat

New Facilities Bond

Cabinet received a summary of recent conversations with a consultant on the possibility of the District going out to the public for another bond in 2024. No decision has been made at this point, but the enrollment recovery campaign and the work on the new Facilities Master Plan will help drive the decision to move forward.
