Mission

Omicron Variant Preparedness

Cabinet discussed Contra Costa County's indoor mask requirement and how it would affect the spring semester in-person classes. Cabinet also confirmed the plan to offer a combination of online, hybrid, and in-person classes. The District ensured there was enough masks for employees and students, ordered test kits, and began implementation of "Ready Education" for the daily health assessment.

Kennedy King Scholarships

Mojdeh informed Cabinet that the deadline to apply for the annual Kennedy King Scholarship program is February 4, 2022.

Enrollment Recovery Program

Kelly updated Cabinet on the District's enrollment recovery program with Interact Communications and SIG. There was agreement to bring Interact to present to Cabinet at a future meeting.

International Students Program

Kelly led a Cabinet discussion about the changing fee structures offered to agents overseas who assist the District in recruiting international students. Consensus was reached to increase the Agency Commission to \$1,000/per student and reassess the decision in one year.

Legislative Matters

Cabinet discussed its support for AB 1187, providing g apportionment for supervised tutoring, and concerns over AB 1505, the recalibration of the Faculty Obligation Number.
