Mission

Bond Anticipation Notes

Cabinet reviewed the recommendation to seek short-term Bond Anticipation Notes in the amount of \$40 million to ensure bond-funded projects can continue as planned. These notes would be paid off with proceeds from the sale of public bonds once the District completes its annual audit.

Termination of Interact Contract

Cabinet reached consensus to end the marketing contract with Interact Communications, but continue the business process improvement work headed by Strata Information Group.

Chancellor's Advisory Councils

Mojdeh shared with Cabinet she has put future advisory council meetings on pause for now. An internal team will be assembled who understands the DEI work to help identify ways these Advisory Councils could contribute to this work.

Future State of Work

Cabinet brainstormed ideas of the future state of work at 4CD as part of the preparation for upcoming union negotiations.

COVID Safety Protocols

Cabinet held a conversation to consider what safety protocols should be continued or eliminated for the summer and fall 2022 semesters.
