#### Mission

The mission of the Chancellor's Cabinet is to serve as the leadership team ensuring the capacity of our District to educate students effectively and meet the needs of our communities in partnership with classified staff, faculty, and other managers.

# **Enrollment Recovery**

Cabinet heard updates on the District's enrollment recovery efforts and planned how collegespecific meetings would take place.

#### **Student Housing**

Cabinet discussed the \$2 billion statewide grant program offered by the Department of Finance for affordable student housing, and reached consensus the District should apply for a planning grant.

### **FTES Targets**

Cabinet reached consensus to stop the enrollment decline and set a FTES target increase for fall 2022.

#### **AB 361**

Cabinet discussed the passage of AB 361 that allows Brown Act meetings to continue to be held virtually. The bill does not apply to committees not under the authority of the Governing Board such as the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee.

## **COVID-19 Plans**

Cabinet continued conversations on the implementation of the vaccine mandate, and the process to apply for an exemption from the mandate.

### **Accreditation Visit**

Cabinet heard an update from the colleges and District Office that all meetings for the accreditation visiting team have been set for November 2-3, 2021.
