Mission

Distance Education

Cabinet discussed how the Academic Senates will participate in future conversations about distance education.

Financial Aid Supervisors

Cabinet reviewed the job description and pay levels of the Financial Aid Supervisor position, and reached consensus to change the job title to Director of Financial Aid with a new salary schedule. The Presidents also requested a systematic review of other college positions that may need updating.

Enrollment Recovery Campaign

Cabinet met with representatives from Interact and SIG and VPIs and VPSSs to discuss implementation steps on the enrollment recovery effort.

COVID-19 Plans

Cabinet discussed and provided input on the implementation of the vaccine requirement for all employees and students. In addition, Cabinet discussed preparations the colleges must implement to be in compliance with the September 14, 2021, County Health Order as it relates to indoor eating establishments and indoor gyms where elevated breathing occurs.

Budget Analysis

Cabinet heard multiple presentations on the development of the District's Adoption Budget to understand how it may impact upcoming labor negotiations.
