IEPI PRT Visit

Cabinet was provided an update on a visiting IEPI-PRT team to the District to assist in the development of a districtwide vision that aligns with the colleges' Diversity Equity and Inclusion work.

COVID Protocols

After discussions with constituent leaders, Cabinet agreed to move forward and follow County Health guidelines which strongly recommends but does not mandate indoor masks.

FCMAT Update

Cabinet heard an update on securing a FCMAT review of the district's procurement procedures. This action was part of the audit findings to ensure we are following best practices and in compliance with the law.

Emergency Conditions

Cabinet learned of the requirements to receive State Chancellor's support for continuation under the Emergency Conditions plan. This plan will help identify steps to ensure the district remains fiscally viable and describes actions to be taken to grow enrollment.
