January 2023 Mission

Director of HR Job Description

Cabinet reviewed and provide input on the draft Director of Human Resources job description. This is a first step to help support the needs of Human Resources and Risk Management.

Districtwide Managers Meeting

Cabinet provided input on the February 3, 2023, districtwide managers meeting. Given the number of topics a second meeting will be scheduled.

Training for Chaperones

Cabinet discussed the need for training for employees who are assigned to chaperone on student field trips.

AB 928 Resolution

Cabinet reviewed a draft Governing Board resolution that advocates the support of the Associate Degree of Transfer pathway without affecting the mission of community colleges.

2023-24 Non-Resident Fees

Cabinet reviewed the proposal to raise the non-resident fees beginning 2023-24, and reached consensus to recommend to the Governing Board to raise the fee to \$358 per unit, in addition to the \$10 capital outlay fee.

IEPI PRT

Cabinet was given an update on progress so far in developing a DEI districtwide framework as part of an IEPI Partnership Resource Team. The plan will leverage the DEI work already begun at the colleges.
