Mission

Volz Company

Cabinet was introduced to the Volz Company, who had been selected to assist the colleges in developing their Facilities Master Plans. A survey will be implemented to include student input, including the interest of building affordable student housing.

IEPI PRT Update

Cabinet was provided a progress report on the IEPI-PRT DEIB work including the scheduling of a half-day retreat on Thursday, May 9, 2023.

FT3 Program

Cabinet received information and gave consensus to revise the FT3 program so that funds can be used to purchase textbooks for both full-time and part-time students.
