Mission

2022-23 Tentative Budget

Cabinet reviewed the revised 2022-23 Tentative Budget that would be placed on the upcoming Governing Board agenda for approval.

50 Percent Law

Cabinet learned the District was not in compliance with the 50 Percent Law, and a formal request to the State Chancellor's Office was needed to ask for an exception along with a correction plan.

IEPI PRT Visit

An update was provided to Cabinet on 4CD plans for an Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative proposal requesting a Partnership Resource Team to provide technical assistance on Diversity Equity and Inclusion efforts.

Revisions to 4CD EEO Plan

Cabinet provided input and guidance on updating the District's Equal Employment Opportunity Plan that must now be alignment with new State Chancellor guidelines.

AB 2627

Cabinet learned the Governor has signed AB 2627, a bill that allows local government to share contact data with 4CD for the purposes of sharing information about programs and services to specific underserved populations in the service territory.

Vaccine Mandate for Spring 2023

Cabinet discussed whether to continue the vaccine mandate into the Spring 2023 semester now that the county has relaxed this requirement.
