### Mission

### Cabinet Mission and Vision

At their July 2023 retreat, Cabinet reviewed and revised their mission and vision statement and will now go to the governance groups for their information.

### All College Day

College presidents reviewed their themes for All College Day activities slated for August 18, 2023, including time for remarks by the Interim Chancellor.

### Distance Education

Cabinet discussed how to staff this work at the colleges and District Office, and will continue exploring how to manage this increasing workload due to student demand for remote courses.

### College and District Anniversaries

Cabinet reached consensus to establish an Adhoc committee to coordinate activities associated with the District's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, CCC's and DVC's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, and LMC's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2024.

### African American Diaspora Education Summit

Cabinet discussed how to support employee attendance at the African Diaspora Education Summit which will take place in Ghana, Africa, September 27-October 6, 2024.

### Zoom Phone Implementation

Cabinet received an update on the transition of the District phone system to Zoom beginning in September. While physical phones will still be available for emergency purposes, most desk phones will be eliminated since the new system is easily incorporated into each computer.
