The mission of the Chancellor's Cabinet is to serve as the leadership team ensuring the capacity of our District to educate students effectively and meet the needs of our communities in partnership with classified staff, faculty, and other managers.

Districtwide Center for Teaching and Learning

Cabinet held a preliminary discussion about the feasibility of a Districtwide center for teaching and learning to provide ongoing professional development opportunities for faculty and staff. It was agreed that more analysis and consultation with additional constituency groups is needed.

Financial Aid Data Trends

Cabinet received a report of current financial aid as it pertains to the SCFF supplemental allocation, including Pell, CCPG and AB 540 data at the college and District levels. While not at pre-pandemic levels, current trends are positive. This information will be made available to all financial aid directors in the dashboard for further review and analysis.

DEIB Plan Framework

Cabinet held a discussion about the need for equity to be kept at the forefront throughout the decision-making process. Furthermore, there was agreement on the need for institutional challenges to be captured daily into the overall DEIB framework, with CREED considered regularly. The framework is expected to be reviewed with DGC at a future meeting.

DGC Survey

Cabinet received a presentation on the DGC survey results which will also be shared with staff after further review and discussion by DGC.

Budget Update

Cabinet received a budget update and a preview of the presentation to be given at the college public fora, which are scheduled throughout the month of April.
