Auto-Awarding Pilot Program Being Considered

Associate Vice Chancellor, Educational Services, Mandy Liang is working with admissions and records and financial aid directors to consider a pilot program for "auto-awarding," which refers to awarding degrees or certificates to students who have met the requirements for those awards even if the student did not apply or petition for them. The pilot would not replace the regular petition process and would be limited to declared programs of study.

Electricity Energy Provider Selected for Board Approval

Vice Chancellor, Facilities Planning and Construction Ines Zildzic reported that, among the three finalists, Oakland-based Commercial Energy (CE) was chosen to be 4CD's new energy provider. The contract with CE will generate at least \$675,000 in electricity cost savings for 4CD. It will also allow future renewable energy to be purchased and support 4CD's overall sustainability goals. The contract will be presented for approval by the Governing Board on May 14.

Summer Enrollment Numbers are Up

Summer enrollments have increased Districtwide, and enrollment for fall 2025 is also up compared to fall 2024, when looking at data retrieved from a similar timeframe one year ago.
