Highlights:

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Teacher of the Year-Durwynne Hsieh



Congratulations to **Dr. Durwynne Hsieh**, co-chair of the LMC Biology department as the District's community college nominee for the 2009-10 Teacher of the Year program. The annual recognition of outstanding teachers is led by the Contra Costa County Office of Education, with the District nominee rotated amongst the colleges and selected by their Academic Senate.

"I was shocked that the LMC Academic Senate told me that I had been selected as the college's teacher of the year," says the modest and unassuming Hsieh. "Perhaps my biggest accomplishment is that after teaching the same courses year after year, I realized my students kept changing so I had to keep changing. Maybe this, along with my compulsion to fix things, have made each semester a new experience." "As an educator, I don't know anyone more naturally skilled, or more self-effacing about his talents," states fellow LMC instructor Mark Lewis. "Over the years, I have stolen more teaching ideas from Durwynne than from anyone else, and his is always the first person I turn to for new ideas to promote student understanding."

"I was fortunate to be a member of the hiring committee when he applied for a teaching position at the LMC Biology department," says former governing board member Jo Ann Cookman. "During the lecture portion of the interview, Durwynne had us on the edge of our seats the entire time. If the committee reacted this way, we figured so would his students. And we were right!"

Dr. Hsieh will be honored, along with the other county nominees, at a gala awards dinner in the Fall.

Thirty-two full and part-time faculty members from all across the District enthusiastically participated in a Great Teacher Seminar and Retreat at the Walnut Creek Embassy Suites Hotel on January 5-7, 2009. Coordinated by LMC retired faculty member Dave Nakaji and supported by HR's **Andrea Gonzalez-Lewis**, this staff development opportunity was the fifth such district-wide event and was especially noteworthy in that the founding "father" and creator of the Great Teacher movement, David Gottshall, came from Chicago to lead the seminar.

Throughout the seminar, participants found creative and effective solutions to real-life teaching problems, actively shared their own successful approaches to teaching and mutually supported each other with respect, dignity, humor and a sense of caring. One participant remarked that one of the beneficial outcomes for her was "being reminded that as teachers, we are not alone. The format of the seminar and the extra time that was given throughout the three days, allowed me to connect with other instructors from so many disciplines. I was able to see the common thread between us so clearly. It gave me a broader vision of what I love to do."

Unlike some seminars which are highly content driven or promote a specific philosophy of teaching, the Great Teacher Seminar is structured to meet the specific,

practical needs of the participants, to seek out the underlying principles of great teaching and to provide a supportive, stimulating environment in which great teaching can be uncovered, celebrated, and acknowledged.

Another participant added "I found the seminar richly rewarding. The best element was allowing time to think, observe and participate in an "unrushed" scheduled and requiring that each small group participant make a contribution. Most importantly, I feel I connected with some very nice people. The seminar is uplifting and inspiring in many subtle ways."
