

District Welcomes New Associate Vice Chancellor/Chief Financial Officer



The Governing Board of the Contra Costa Community College District approved the hiring of Serena M. Muindi as the new Associate Vice-Chancellor of Finance/Chief Financial Officer. She will oversee the accounting and finance, payroll and purchasing functions for the District.

Muindi brings over 16 years of finance and budget experience within the California Community College System. Her prior position was Director of Fiscal Services/Controller at the San Jose Evergreen Community College District, with responsibility for accounting, purchasing, payroll, budget and grants departments.

"We are very pleased to bring Serena on board in this very important position," says Vice Chancellor, Administrative Services' Kindred Murillo. "We have been searching for two years to find the right candidate, and believe she has the combination of interpersonal skills, business understanding, and leadership to help this District navigate the fiscal challenges we face due to the state's budget crisis."

Muindi has an M.B.A. from the University of Phoenix and began her business and finance career in accounting at I.B.M. She has also served as a board member for the Whisman School District and the Community Health Awareness Council; both are in Mountain View, California.

Classified Chancellor's Chat



Approximately 75 classified staff from throughout the District attended the March 5th Chancellor's Chat at the CCSIG building in Pleasant Hill.

The March 2010 Classified Chancellor's Chat gave classified employees the opportunity to listen and ask questions of Chancellor **Helen Benjamin**. Given the tough fiscal times, many questions focused on the budget crisis, the new allocation model, pending classification study, and concerns over lay-offs.

The chancellor began her comments by asking attendees to answer this question: "In the face of unprecedented reductions, difficult decisions need to be made. If I were the Chancellor of our District, I would…" An index card was given to everyone to record their anonymous response to be considered by the Chancellor.

"I value and appreciate that Helen invited **Mike West** to help respond to questions about classified layoffs", commented **Sue Rohlicek**, DVC senior administrative assistant. "It means a lot to know that there is a mutual respect between the District administration and the classified union."

District Continues American Heart Association Support

Clean Energy Workforce Training Program Press Conference



Contra Costa County Supervisor Federal Glover (left) and Hilary Bishop Pearson (right) from Senator Boxer's office joined approximately 75 attendees to recognize this grant that will prepare workers for the growing demand of clean energy iobs.

The District, along with the Workforce Development Board of Contra Costa County, held a press conference last month to publicly announce the Clean Energy Workforce Training Program. This program will prepare 180 unemployed or underemployed construction workers in the emerging clean energy fields, and is part of the nation's largest state-supported green jobs training program.

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The \$1 million grant is leveraged with over \$1.3 million of in-kind support from a number of community partners. Students will be trained for positions such as a solar photovoltaic installer; solar thermal technician; solar installation manager; project foreman; solar designer; solar engineer; heating, air conditioning, and refrigeration technician; heating, ventilation, air conditioning maintenance and repair trainee; green plumber and pipefitter; energy field auditor; home energy rating specialist; building analyst; building performance contractor; building envelope specialist; and weatherization auditor.

"This partnership is an investment in Contra Costa County. As one of the largest multi-college Districts in the state, collaborations like these are necessary to create a trained workforce," said **Dr. Deborah Blue**, vice chancellor of Districtwide Planning and Educational Services, Contra Costa Community College District. "Community colleges are the leaders in preparing the skilled workforce in areas such as law enforcement, fire fighters and nurses. We are now prepared to meet the needs of clean energy jobs."
