# **New DVC Transit Center**



A ground breaking ceremony was held on Tuesday, November 17, 2009, celebrating the long-awaited DVC transit center located just south of the intersection of Old Quarry and Golf Club roads. The project, expected to be completed by June 4, 2010, is funded through a number of sources including a congressional earmark from former Congresswoman Ellen Tauscher and state transit bonds.

The center is envisioned as a hub for public transit commuters to hop on express buses to and from all parts of Contra Costa and Solano counties. Guest speakers at the ceremony included DVC President Judy Walters and Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors Supervisor, District 2, Gayle B. Uilkema.

"DVC issues over 13,000 parking permits per semester, yet we only have 3,200 available parking spaces," says Judy Walters. "The DVC transit center will provide improvements in transit and link access, as well as alternative commuter options-reducing the parking issues as our numbers indicate."

The Contra Costa Community College District, founded in 1948 and governed by a publicly elected five-member board, is one of the largest multi-college community college districts in California. The mission of the District is to transform and enhance the lives of students, and through them, the communities served.

Supervisor Uilkema notes "DVC has a great need for an improved transit center and the goals of the project are to: improve transit access, safety and traffic circulation, reduce additional parking need, and separate transit access from other vehicle access."

During construction, buses and cars will be rerouted into parking lot No. 8. Although a few parking spaces will be lost temporarily, the final configuration will yield about 20 additional spaces.

## **DVC Alumnus Receives CCLC Award**



University of California at Riverside chancellor Dr. Timothy White received a Distinguished Alumni Award at the recent Community College League of California annual convention.

Born in Buenos Aires, White immigrated with his family to Canada and then to Northern California, where he began his higher education career at Diablo Valley College (DVC).

"I learned a lot about myself and my academic abilities during my time at DVC," he reflects. "The courses I took helped prepare me for my undergraduate degree in four years, and my involvement in intercollegiate athletics – swimming and water polo – built self-confidence and furthered my clear understanding of the power of teamwork and focusing on goals."

In 1966-67, White was named as a Junior College All-American in both swimming and water polo, and made the All Golden Gate Conference in both sports. He was inducted into the DVC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

After DVC, he achieved his B.A. degree at California State University, Fresno; his M.S. degree at California State University, Hayward; and his Ph.D. at UC Berkeley. His academic background is in physiology, kinesiology and human biodynamics, and he is internationally recognized for his work in muscle plasticity, injury and aging.
