Police Services Receive Bike Program Donations



Officer **Thomas Holt** is on a roll. As a recent hire into the Police Services department, he joined other officers in a requirement to select a campus community policing project and decided to raise money to expand the department's bicycle program.

"I never wrote a grant proposal in my life, so this was something new and challenging for me," says Holt. "It has been an exciting time because so far I have successfully obtained three grants totaling \$3,000."

The bicycle program is a great way to keep officers outdoors, physically fit, and visible on the campuses. Officers are more accessible to the students, and the bikes allow them to get around campus quicker and more efficiently. In addition, officers who elect to participate in the program use the bikes as their primary transportation which minimizes the use of patrol vehicles.

"We created the campus community policing project about a year ago as a way to build better relationships," says Police Chief **Charles Gibson**. We are proud of Officer Holt's accomplishment particularly during these tough fiscal times."



District's All-Deans Meeting

A meeting for all academic deans was held on December 7, 2009, at the Contra Costa County Schools Insurance Group in Pleasant Hill. The meeting gathered the instructional and non-instructional deans of the colleges, in addition to the college presidents, and the Chancellor to discuss pertinent issues.
