Teacher of the Year

Contra Costa College (CCC) is proud to announce the selection of **James Conrad** as their nominee for the 2009-10 Contra Costa County's Teacher of the Year awards. The program began in 1972 and is open to all county teachers in public and private schools who teach pre-kindergarten through community college.



Conrad is a Physics instructor and has been teaching at CCC for 21 years. Prior to teaching he was an engineer. His passion is music, and though it does not directly correlate with teaching Physics, it has helped him incorporate interesting teaching techniques on sound that the students enjoy.

In reflecting on his teaching career he still remembers the first day of his first class. "I experienced an immediate feeling of knowing I was where I belonged. The students are receptive and responsive, hungry for education, and bettering themselves", says Conrad. "It is gratifying to win this award at the end of my career, having my hard work throughout the years recognized is an amazing feeling."

"James has an enriched background that contributes to his success", says CCC Academic Senate President **Richard Akers.** "It is an honor to support and promote the great work performed by our faculty. I respect his dedication to the students. He has mentored faculty and has the magnetism factor that is appreciated by everyone."

Green Industry Employer Council

Given our current economy, finding jobs for our graduates who successfully complete training at our three colleges is perhaps the most challenging part of the Clean Energy Workforce Training Program (CEWTP). That is why the creation of the Green Industry Employer Council (Council) was considered a critical part of this program.

The Council's purpose is to advise the program on curriculum development, highlight trends in the industry, provide information on emerging technology, and be a pool of potential employers for graduates of the program. The inaugural meeting took place on May 3, 2010, and has approximately 18-20 serving members.

"I look forward to defining the mission statement for the training program, as well as having discussions about the training curriculum, and the outreach program to the specific employers (like the area HVAC contractors, window installers, insulation companies, and Whole House Energy Auditing companies doing weatherization)", commented council member Richard T. Edwards, Vice President of Operations for Pacific InterWest Building Consultants, Inc.



Approximately 180 students will be served through the program. The first CEWTP cohorts have already completed their first courses and are now preparing for certification testing. The selection of program participants focuses on retraining displaced, unemployed former construction workers (including Veterans), for "green collar" jobs and careers.

CCC's Financial Aid Department Award



The Contra Costa College financial aid department was selected as one of four postsecondary institutions nationwide to win USA Funds 2010 Excellence in Debt Management award. The award is based on the college's effort to creatively help students increase their financial literacy and minimize and manage their student loan debt.

The CCC Financial Aid team (pictured above) provided individual loan counseling, offered financial aid lab hours, educated students of their financial aid rights and responsibilities, informed students about scholarships and work-study programs, and assisted in developing budgets as a financial roadmap. The department relied on USA Funds' web-based tools to assist with educating students on financial literacy, loan counseling and default prevention.

In addition, the Financial Aid department joined forces with faculty and other student services departments to offer money management workshops to specialized student populations. As a result, the 2007 CCC student loan default rate decreased to 9.8 percent from 20.3 percent in 2003.

CCC student worker Reza Rezvani (right) said the "USA Funds online courses are extremely convenient. There are no time constraints or deadlines and the website is communicative and easy to understand. I am able to walk away with more knowledge on budget and credit, feeling like a well-rounded individual."

Although graduates are successfully finding jobs, the partners continue to work with LMC to update the curriculum to address contemporary industry needs. Recently, the college held a ceremony to honor industry donors who have contributed generously to the program.
