

# 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Book on Sale





College chairpersons of the Datatel Colleague Process Expert Team (PET) were recognized for their leadership by the Governing Board at their October 21, 2009, meeting.

PET was created in April 2008 after consultant Strata Information Group conducted an Information Technology Review for the District. Business reengineering and training were identified as District priority items, so a team consisting of Admissions & Records, Curriculum, Financial Aid, Human Resources and Payroll staff from each campus, as well as the District Office convened to address the challenges.

The teams focused on reviewing their business processes, developing best practices and uniformity where pertinent, and compiling training documentation to ensure that all members of the unit had the appropriate knowledge base.

## **New DVC Signs**



Diablo Valley College (DVC) proudly unveiled new signs recently to help welcome visitors and students to the campus. Over the years, there have been many visitors and students alike who have been frustrated at how difficult it was to locate the campus or uncertain as to when they have actually arrived on the campus.

The largest of the four new signs is located at the entrance of the campus on Golf Club Road. Not only do they boast the

year the campus was established, the design of the signs include the silhouette of Mt. Diablo across the top.

This great signage accomplishment comes as the DVC campus celebrates its 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The signs were unveiled on October 1, 2009, by President **Judy Walters** and Contra Costa Community College District Board president Sheila Grili.

"I think the signs are sturdy enough to take us through the next 60 years", stated Dr. Judy Walters.

### **District Awarded Clean Jobs Grant**

The Contra Costa Community College District (District), in collaboration with the Contra Costa Workforce Development Board and other partners, was awarded a one million dollar (\$1,000,000) grant to help jumpstart California's Clean Energy Jobs Training Program. The District was one of 34 recipients statewide that shared in the \$27 million in grants available as part of the largest state-sponsored green jobs program in the nation.

The District's program is called the Contra Costa Green Building Retraining Partnership (CCGBRP), and will serve at least 180 participants during the grant period which runs through June 30, 2011. The grant will also substantially expand the capacity to provide training for these jobs and careers in the future.

"This award is a testament to the strong collaboration we have in Contra Costa County that focuses on getting our residents back to work," says District vice chancellor **Deborah Blue**. "We are ready to train the "green collar" workforce of the future, and look forward to doing our part in rebuilding the economy."

Over the next eighteen months, the CCGBRP's training program will be implemented at Contra Costa College in West County, Diablo Valley College in Central County, and Los Medanos College in East County. Each will augment its existing construction training program by developing and offering new training options that address both the demand for new workforce skill sets in the solar and energy efficiency industries and the retraining needs of workers in the construction industry recently downsized as a result of the real estate slump.

Employers project a growing number of jobs in numerous positions including solar photovoltaic installer; solar thermal technician; solar installation manager/project foreman; solar designer/engineer; heating, air conditioning, and refrigeration technician; HVAC maintenance/repair trainee; green plumber and pipefitter; residential/ commercial/industrial energy field auditor; home energy rating specialist; building analyst; building performance contractor; building envelope specialist; and weatherization auditor. At the same time, employers indicate great difficulty finding qualified personnel for many of these occupations.

The District has begun the process of selecting a program director and building a Green Business Council advisory group that will help guide the program and provide jobs for training graduates. Recruiting will be coordinated through local EDD onestop centers and focus on retraining unemployed and underemployed workers with construction experience. Studies indicate that workers with construction experience are the "primary recruiting pool" for these positions.
