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District Leadership Changes

On June 29, 2010, Diablo Valley College (DVC) president **Dr. Judy Walters** announced her retirement effective October 1, 2010. The District will conduct a national search for a new leader with the goal of having one in place by July 1, 2011.

Los Medanos College (LMC) president **Peter Garcia** agreed to be the acting DVC president, and LMC senior dean of instruction **Richard Livingston** was appointed acting LMC president during this transition period.

The decision to fill Dr. Walters' vacancy on an interim basis with someone within the organization was made so the District could focus its time and energy on filling the permanent presidency position.

During her three years as DVC president, Dr. Walters has helped the college grow

and change in many ways. She brought faculty, classified, and administrators together to overcome the unauthorized grade change issue, identifying and implementing needed changes while providing reassurance with regular updates to the community. Then came the accreditation decision, challenging the college to uphold its reputation. Dr. Walters built an effective participative model that included students to come up with solutions acceptable to the accreditation commission.

Her tenure also resulted in important changes with faculty working on curriculum and student learning outcomes, units designing and completing their first program reviews, and ensuring the DVC classified staff fully participated on committees and in the classified senate. As the state's budget crisis hit the District and colleges, she helped create a more open and expanded budget process to help the college better understand the difficult decision-making process. Better communication at the college has also occurred both formally and informally, sharing information about what the college is doing, how they were doing it, and where they were going. **Peter Garcia** has been the LMC President in Pittsburg since 2002, where he has served in various capacities for the past 20 years. He previously held the positions of Vice President of Academic and Student Affairs, Dean of Economic Development, Dean of Human-

istic Studies, faculty researcher, philosophy instructor, and offensive line coach at LMC.

He holds a Master of Divinity from the Dominican School Of Philosophy and Theology, a Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy from St. Albert's College and a Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration from California State University, Chico. President Garcia has previously served on four accreditation teams, and is currently a member of the board of Chief Executive Officers of the California Community Colleges.

Richard Livingston is the Senior Dean of Instruction at LMC. He is a community college graduate who also earned degrees at Stanford University and the University of the Pacific. He served as a Peace Corps volunteer in Costa Rica and also worked as a journalist. Richard was a founding faculty member at LMC and

taught journalism, English and interdisciplinary humanities for 14 years. Prior to his current position, he has had a variety of District management positions including Director of Personnel Services, Dean of Humanities, Dean of Social and Economic Sciences and Dean of Liberal Arts and Sciences.
