
Chancellor Benjamin welcomes attendees to the annual districtwide classified meeting.

or most people who participate in a study abroad program, they will say it was an experience that changed their life. For underrepresented students who do not have the financial resources, the opportunity to live and study in another country is just a dream.

That is about to change with a new scholarship program targeting historically disadvantaged students who tradi-

tionally had little chance of achieving this experience.

Two \$2,500 Study Abroad Scholarship awards are available to continuing students attending any college within the District (CCC, LMC, or DVC) intending to participate in a study abroad program. The semester-long program can be taken during the 2012-13

academic year. To be eligible an applicant must possess at least a 2.8 GPA, be enrolled in at least 9 units for the spring 2012 term, demonstrate financial need and have a records of volunteer and community involvement. Applicants must also meet all the eligibility requirements to participate in the study abroad program, with preference given to applicants from historically underrepresented backgrounds.

"The issue of economically disadvantages students not participating in study abroad programs is well known and often discussed nationwide," says Chancellor **Helen Benjamin**. "We are in business to provide educational opportunities that will change lives, and we hope these scholarships will contribute to a life-changing educational opportunity for a couple of deserving students who otherwise would not be able to participate."

Funds for these scholarships were provided by a contribution from Chancellor Benjamin and the DVC International Education Center.
