## CCC Auto Service Department Wins \$50,000 Grant



**C**ontra Costa College’s Collision Repair Program received the Collision Repair Education Foundation’s 2013 Ultimate Collision Education Makeover school grant representing the AAA Northern California Region.

The Education Makeover school grant winners were announced at the organization’s 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Industry Reception held during the SEMA show in Las Vegas late last year. Over \$250,000 in grants were awarded and Contra Costa College received \$50,000.

Over 125 high school and college collision programs from across the country applied for the grant and four schools received the \$50,000 award; others received a grant of \$10,000.

Contra Costa College (CCC) Automotive Technology program is one of the leading career technical programs in the State. The program also received its “Green Certification” recently and is proud of the curriculum which allows students from urban communities to learn state-of-the-art procedures and techniques which can be applied to a vastly changing auto environment.
