## **Active Shooter Training**

A ugust 4 is usually pretty quiet at our colleges since the summer session is already over. Not this year at Diablo Valley College, as District police officers participated in a joint active shooter training hosted by the Pleasant Hill Police Department in the Life and Health Sciences building. The mandatory training took place over the course of three days and marked the first time this exercise has occurred on DVC's campus.

"One of the main learning outcomes was coordinating and working with Pleasant Hill PD," said Contra Costa College police lieutenant and department training officer **Jose Oliveira.** "It also gives the Pleasant Hill PD officers the opportunity to become more familiar with the college campus."

"We conduct this type of proactive training out of an abundance of caution and as a best practice," said Pleasant Hill Police Sergeant Tim Frank, who led the training. "As with all of our training, we strive to keep the curriculum current and training realistic. Training together is mutually beneficial and assures a united coordinated response to an active shooter incident within our respective jurisdictions."

The active shooter exercise is part of the ongoing training District police officers participate in. "Our training is actually regulated by the California Department of Justice, Police Officer Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.). Every officer has to complete a minimum of 24 hours of advance training every two years," explained Lt. Oliveira. Upcoming fall training sessions will include Tactical Communication and Cultural Awareness.

The Contra Costa Community College District, founded in 1948 and governed by a publicly elected five-member board, is one of the largest multi-college community college districts in California. The mission of the District is to attract and transform students and communities by providing accessible, innovative and outstanding higher education learning opportunities and support services.

## **DVC Instructor Awarded Fellowship in London**

Diablo Valley College (DVC) Accounting Instructor Gary Pieroni was awarded the 2015-16 International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) Academic Fellowship in London.

"This once-in-a-lifetime opportunity allows me to work alongside the best of the best in my field in initiatives taken up by the IASB and I am deeply privileged to have been chosen to work with a select group from academia, market regulators, industry, and public accounting," said Pieroni. "I believe this is truly an honor for DVC to be associated with a prestigious, global institution that influences both public and privately-held companies, and clearly demonstrates that DVC has faculty that can do relevant work."

Pieroni believes this experience will benefit students, programs, and the college by growing DVC's global exposure as an internationally connected campus and increases the magnet effect in attracting international students to the college.

The event takes place on September 29, 2014, at the Mira Vista Golf and Country Club in El Cerrito.

Gomes has served as Mayor of San Pablo an admirable seven times. He has also served on the San Pablo City Council, Planning Commission and Housing Authority. Gomes was key in bringing the San Pablo Lytton Casino to San Pablo which continues to generate the revenue necessary to fund many projects within the city.

His contributions to the District are numerous. In addition to being involved in this fundraiser since its inception, Gomes was so instrumental in securing night lighting for the CCC soccer field, the arena was renamed "Joe Gomes Soccer Field."

Though he is well known for his community service, Gomes' ties to the District are also personal. His granddaughter **Rose Helms** works as an Accounting Specialist for the District Office in Martinez, and she was overjoyed to learn her grandfather was being recognized for his accomplishments.

"I have always looked up to my grandpa. He has instilled in me strong family values and work ethic," says Helms. "He has always inspired me to do my best, help others, and get involved. He is an icon to me."
