The Los Medanos College (LMC) chapter of Alpha Gamma Sigma (AGS) State Honors Society is uniting student government, clubs and programs campuswide to help save the lives of those living with blood cancers.

The students are collaborating to raise awareness and increase matches for an ethnically diverse population. LMC's Student Life Office offers bone marrow and blood drives year-round in collaboration with Blood Centers of the Pacific, which encourages people of color to donate.

"Last year the AGS club coordinated their bone marrow efforts with one of our regularly scheduled blood drives in an effort to increase the awareness of blood cancers, said **Demetria Lawrence**, Student Life Coordinator. "This year they wanted to continue their efforts and have gotten sponsorship from the Inter-Club Council (ICC) and Associated Students as well as Student Life."

AGS member Debora van Eckhardt believes encouraging people from all backgrounds to donate helps support an increasingly diverse population. "It's extremely important for our community to be aware of this need. Personally, I had someone close to me who recently received a bone marrow transplant," shared van Eckhardt. "If we had more people donate, more lives could be saved."

Lifters from all over the world came to compete, and Barnes secured three number one spots: 1st Place Bench, 1st Place Dead Lift and Best Woman Dead Lifter.

Barnes powerlifting career was as unexpected as her recent win. After meeting a young lady who was a power lifter, Barnes, who was 40 at the time, decided to give it a try. Since then, she's been lifting her way to the top.

"Going to the World Championships has been my goal," shared Barnes. "It's really hard to put into words how I felt at that moment, but I did jump and give a big yell!"
