process as District Senior Dean of Research **Greg Stoup** led three exercises meant to collect crucial feedback. Attendees worked in small groups to facilitate discussions around the District's core values, vision for the future and the organizational mission necessary to realize that vision.

Stoup, who is coordinating the strategic plan process alongside Mehdizadeh, sees his role in collecting data beyond that of a researcher. "The metaphor that comes to mind is that of an orchestrator. Not a composer or designer or even architect, but rather as someone who synthesizes the voices and perspectives of many different individuals into a coherent whole," explained Stoup. "What's fascinating about this exercise, is that there is something of an underlying harmony in all the feedback we've received. And, if we do a good job, that harmony should express itself in the final plan."

Stoup will use the feedback captured during the first dialogue as a foundation for the second meeting, where discussions will shift to the development of strategic directions meant to align the District activities with community needs. The second dialogue took place Wednesday, November 7, 2018, at the Winslow Center Assembly Room in Pleasant Hill.
