On Thursday, August 19, 2022, Interim Chancellor **Mojdeh Mehdizadeh** gave in-person remarks at the three All College Day events, focusing less on the traditional strategic direction speech, and instead encouraging everyone to think about kindness, caring, and compassion. She reflected on the faculty and classified who impacted her own educational journey, while thanking current employees for making impactful differences in our students lives.

Contra Costa College (CCC) Acting President **Kimberly Rogers** gave a warm welcome and emphasized cultivating collaboration, along with **Kenyetta Tribble**, who returns to CCC as acting Vice President of Student Services from her permanent position as the Senior Dean at the DVC – San Ramon Campus.
