# **Congressman DeSaulnier Art Competition**

**S** ince his election in 2015, 4CD has had the honor of partnering with Congressman Mark DeSaulnier in judging submissions from students in California's 10th District for the Congressional Art Competition. Recently, four employees from across the district had the opportunity to judge art from students in this year's Competition. **Dana Davis**, Fine & Media Arts faculty at Contra Costa College, **Christopher Marker**, Photography faculty from Diablo Valley College, along with **Eric Sanchez** and **John Schall**, Art faculty from Los Medanos College, provided their expertise and selected the winning piece created by Jazlyn Xiao of Campolindo High School, with her colored pencil submission entitled "Future Is In My Hands."

Her work is now headed for display in Washington DC. The Congressional Art Competition is a nationwide program established by the U.S. House of Representatives to recognize and encourage artistic talent around the country.

## **Kennedy-King Scholarship Ceremony**

The 55th annual Kennedy King Scholarship Awards dinner, held on May 12, 2023, at the Concord Hilton Hotel, honored 27 undergraduates and eight graduates for their academic achievements. With family and friends surrounding them, proud recipients share their educational aspirations now made possible through their scholarship awards.

Founded in memory of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Senator Robert F. Kennedy, the Kennedy King Memorial Scholarship has granted nearly \$6,144,000 in scholarships to almost 1,000 students since its founding. All scholars have completed at least two years of study at Contra Costa College, Diablo Valley College, or Los Medanos College, and have been accepted at a four-year university to complete their undergraduate studies. Scholarships for graduate students are for students who previously received a Kennedy King undergraduate scholarship. 




## **DVC Hosts Art Building Ribbon Cutting**

• Nay 4th, Diablo Valley College celebrated their new Art Complex. The 37,000-square-foot building brings all DVC art programs back under one roof. The building features art studios and classrooms, an art gallery, printmaking shop, wet photography lab, ceramics workshops, media labs, outdoor display spaces, and faculty offices.

The Art Complex was recognized by the California Community Colleges Board of Governors and awarded the Best Innovative Project Award for Excellence in Energy and Sustainability. This cutting-edge, two-story building boasts an "H" shape configuration, with an open courtyard space and sustainable design features promoting healthy learning environments. The Art Complex is set to achieve LEED Gold V4 certification, exceeding 4CD's LEED Silver target.







# Tesla Ribbon Cutting

**O**n May 9th, after five years of planning, DVC and Tesla celebrated the opening of Tesla's new robotics training center housed within DVC's Engineering and Technology Building with a ribbon cutting ceremony.

Tesla START is an intensive training program that provides individuals with the skills necessary for a

successful career at Tesla. During the program, individuals develop technical expertise and earn certifications through in-class theory, hands-on labs, and self-paced learning.

Tesla partners with colleges across the country to integrate Tesla START into curriculum as a 14-to-16-week capstone course. Tesla has partnered with only 3 colleges in California with DVC being the newest.

## **CCC JAZZ-ology Wins**
