## **Hispanic Heritage Month Celebrated**


Throughout Hispanic Heritage Month (Sept. 15-Oct. 15), the 4CD colleges honored and uplifted the histories, cultures, and contributions of Hispanic and Latine communities through impactful and engaging events. At Contra Costa College, the celebrations included a vibrant Día de Muertos Festival featuring food, music, poetry, raffles, and a performance of La Casa Azul: Frida's Blue House, written and directed by CCC's Carlos-Manuel Chavarria, Professor of Theatre,

Diablo Valley College marked the month with a range of educational and cultural programming, beginning with "Hidden Histories," a presentation exploring Maroon communities in Latin America. The celebration continued with a visit from Dr. Víctor Ríos, MacArthur Fellow and renowned author, who spoke about the systemic challenges faced by Latino youth and the power of resilience.

At Los Medanos College, Hispanic Heritage Month coincided with Undocumented Student Success Week, culminating in the 14th Annual 4CD DREAMers Conference: Día de la Familia. This family-focused event featured dance lessons, free legal services, cultural workshops, community resources, and performances, all in the spirit of empowerment and inclusion. Together, these celebrations across our campuses reflect the District's commitment to equity, belonging, and honoring the diverse identities that make up our community.

## Undocumented Student Success Week Honored

At their October 8, 2025, meeting, the 4CD Governing Board approved a Resolution recognizing October 13-17, 2025, as Undocumented



Student Success Week, and the theme was "Together in Purpose, Grounded in Belonging." Throughout the week, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office encourages colleges to host local workshops, policy forums, and campus events focused on reimagining support structures—centering cultural affirmation, trauma-informed practices, and access to life-changing resources like experiential learning, fellowships, and entrepreneurship pathways.

## **CCC Professor Mark Wong Honored as Faculty** Member of the Year

Contra Costa College (CCC) Professor Mark Wong has been honored with the 2025 Faculty Member Award for the Pacific Region by the National Association of Community College Trustees (ACCT).

The ACCT's regional awards recognize one outstanding faculty member from each of the five U.S. regions. Awardees are chosen for their leadership, innovation, and measurable impact on students' academic journeys. Professor Wong was officially recognized at the ACCT Leadership Congress earlier this month. He was one of five finalists for the national Faculty award.

A champion for accessible STEM education, Professor Wong plays a pivotal role in mentoring students through CCC's APECS Club, a student-led initiative focused on engineering, flight, and robotics. Along with Professor Jon Celesia, he also helps lead CCC's involvement in NASA's National Community College Aerospace Scholars program, guiding students toward hands-on research and industry-level exploration.

"Mark's leadership and compassion make a lasting impact on our students and our community," said CCC President Dr. Kimberly R. Rogers.

In September, Professor Wong was also honored by the Contra Costa County Office of Education as one of 22 teachers of the year who were recognized for their outstanding contributions to students throughout the region.

## **DVC Breaks Ground on New Engineering Building**

Diablo Valley College (DVC) held a groundbreaking ceremony on Oct.15 to kick off the construction of its new, 32,500-square-foot Engineering Technology Building on the Pleasant Hill campus. Funded by the 2014 Measure E bond, the \$56.8 million facility will open in fall 2027.

The state-of-the-art building will house programs in engineering, construction, architecture, industrial design, electronics, and energy systems, preparing students for careers in robotics, automation, and

clean energy. Key features include 3D printing labs, CNC and CAD labs, a machine shop, and robotics and electrical labs.

"This building's innovative and flexible spaces are designed for expanded hands-on learning opportunities," said DVC President **Dr. Monica Chahal**. "In partnership with leading employers and industry advisors, we continue the important work of preparing students for rewarding careers in high-demand fields. By investing in this facility, DVC and the District are ensuring that future generations of students have the skills and opportunity to drive California's innovation economy."
